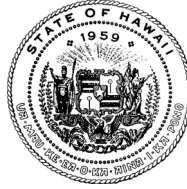

V. Office of Wellness and Resilience (OWR) Updates	<p>Trauma-Informed Training Certification Roll-Out</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> As part of OWR's 2025 Kūpa'a Maui Ola Summit, OWR facilitated Modules 1–3 of the State of Hawai'i Trauma-Informed Certification Course. Over 140 state employees from various departments completed the first three modules. Department of Education (DOE), Judiciary, and one additional department are not on Department of Human Resources Development's (DHRD) Adobe Learning Management application; OWR is working to get modules on their respective systems. Two pilot tests were conducted for the synchronous portion (Modules 4–8): November 12, 2025 (14 participants); November 18, 2025 (24 participants). Formative and summative feedback collected; updates made to curriculum. Launch moved to end of February. Modules 1–4 delivered asynchronously via DHRD's Adobe Learning Management System (LMS). Modules 5–8 delivered live on February 26, 2026. - OWR named to ACE Resource Network (ARN) inaugural national cohort.

- Q from Melissa Miyashiro (HANO): When are results expected and how will they be shared? Response: Webinars and community org partnerships; data ready by August 2026.

2026 Legislative Session

- OWR did not submit legislative proposals in the admin package this year.

Discussion on Engaging State Departments and Community Partners in OWR Initiatives</p>	<p>Bridgette Bennett (Judiciary): Judiciary held a debriefing with staff who completed all three modules and the summit. Lisa Lum spearheaded conversation on adopting TIC in Judiciary systems. Judiciary is interested in moving forward with implementation. Barrier noted: once certified, workload must be reconsidered alongside employee wellness.</p> <p>Opportunities: train-the-trainer model; training supervisors on trauma-informed supervision to support retention.</p> <p>Jillian Freitas (UH JABSOM): Asked about outreach to Queens Healthcare and the Dept. of Native Hawaiian Health on Caregiver Wellness.</p> <p>Scott Shimabukuro (Chair): Need for multiple levels of engagement; concern about how the message is communicated to direct staff.</p> <p>Josie Howard (We Are Oceania): Training targeting leadership/HR had great feedback; emphasized empowering organizations to change policies to be more trauma-informed.</p> <p>Fern Yoshida (DOE): DOE has structured annual trainings with required hours. Suggested TIC trainings could be embedded in DOE annual requirements.</p> <p>Judith Clark (HSYNC): Employees and leadership need incentives showing how TIC makes their job easier. Asked about ongoing requirements to maintain TIC certification. OWR noted a learning collaborative framework is being outlined.</p>	<p>OWR to explore embedding TIC certification in DOE and Judiciary annual training structures.</p> <p>OWR to investigate outreach to Queens Healthcare and Dept. of Native Hawaiian Health.</p> <p>OWR to develop ongoing TIC certification learning collaborative framework.</p>

<p>Comment</p>	<p>Referenced a California bill encouraging — rather than requiring — doctors to pursue TIC certification. Noted success with teachers using brain research as a key resource. Suggested credentialing should begin before practitioners enter the field.</p> <p>Fern Yoshida (DOE): OWR would need to meet with the Office of Talent Management regarding this idea.</p>	<p>Management regarding pre-service TIC credentialing pathways.</p>
